SAYN INTERNATIONAL MOBILITIES

TRAINING COURSE

Amman, Jordan | 29 May – 3 June 2024

The first SAYN mobility was a Training Course held in Amman, Jordan.

The activity focused on introducing the SAYN methodology and strengthening cooperation among partners.

Participants took part in interactive sessions, group discussions, and non-formal education activities.

Sport-based exercises and activities supported communication and trust.



A football match and other group activities encouraged active participation.

Cultural visits to Petra, Wadi Rum, and Aqaba were included in the programme.

These experiences strengthened intercultural understanding and group cohesion.



YOUTH EXCHANGE

Tunis, Tunisia | 23–29 September 2024

The second mobility was an international Youth Exchange in Tunis, Tunisia.

It involved 24 young participants aged 18–24.

Participants came from Croatia, Germany, Italy, Jordan, Lebanon, and Tunisia.



The exchange focused on empowering young people in NEET situations.

Sport and non-formal education were used as tools for motivation and learning.

Participants joined outdoor activities, teamwork exercises, and soft skills sessions.

Intercultural nights and cultural exchange activities were key highlights. Camping and sightseeing created a unique and engaging learning environment.



JOB SHADOWING

Rijeka, Croatia | 9–15 May 2025

The third mobility was a Job Shadowing activity in Rijeka, Croatia.

The activity aimed to provide practical insight into professional environments.

Participants attended briefings and working sessions.



Meetings were held at PAR University of Applied Sciences.

Observation of daily work practices supported professional learning.

Field trips and team-building activities were also organised.

The mobility strengthened employability skills and career awareness.

The SAYN mobilities supported young people in building confidence and motivation.

Participants strengthened teamwork, communication, and leadership skills.

International cooperation and intercultural dialogue were actively promoted.

The mobilities created lasting connections between young people and youth workers.
